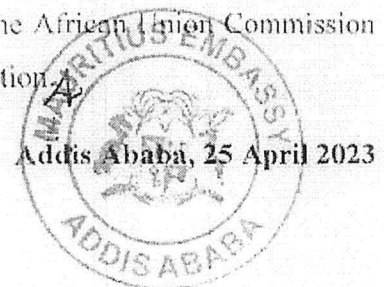

The University of Mauritius invites applications from suitably qualified candidates for the post of **SSR CHAIR OF AFRICAN STUDIES**.

The SSR Chair of African Studies will be responsible to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Academia) through the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities.

S/He will be responsible to promote knowledge creation and dissemination through research and capacity building in areas of pertinence to the African continent, foster linkages and networking across research institutions within Africa, promote research works pertaining to the African diaspora, consolidate knowledge in different spheres related to economic, political, social, institutional and cultural development amongst others and ensure a sustainable research culture on African economies and societies with a view to particularly helping Africa to achieve its SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals).

**QUALIFICATIONS**

The occupant of the Chair should be a scholar or public figure who has attained distinction in his/her discipline as evidenced in:

- Track record of extensive publications;
- Public recognition of his/her contributions to academia and public life;
- A broad extra-mural record;
- A commitment to scholarship or public service in any field, including the arts, social sciences as well as economics that advance knowledge of, and in, Africa.

The Chair of African Studies should be a full-fledged Professor with a PhD qualification and should:

- Have at least 10 years' experience in teaching and /or research at university level or at any recognized institution at national level/international level;
- Be able to demonstrate that exceptional distinction has been achieved and maintained in research (and professional practice, where applicable);
- Have made a significant intellectual contribution in the area of his/her specialisation; and
- Have demonstrated academic leadership.

- a) The SSR Chair of African Studies will be remunerated at the rate of Rs 110,125/- per month plus salary compensation at approved rates.

## DUTIES

The SSR Chair should be a versatile person able to bridge the disciplinary divide. During his/her tenure, the Chair will be required to:

- Conduct research and develop links with other research institutions based in Africa and elsewhere but which conduct research on Africa;
- Liaise with scholars in Mauritius and Africa as well as those who carry out research exclusively on the African continent;
- Develop programmes of study focusing on African issues;
- Supervise MPhil/PhD research works with respect to African studies;
- Responsible for promoting research on issues affecting Africa;
- Deliver public lectures and addresses;
- Produce a publishable manuscript on his/her research; and
- Prepare a report detailing the results achieved at the end of the tenure period.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- Promote knowledge creation and dissemination through research and capacity building in areas of pertinence to the African continent.
- Foster linkages and networking across research institutions within Africa.
- Promote research works pertaining to the African diaspora.
- Consolidate knowledge in different spheres related to economic, political, social, institutional and cultural development amongst others.

## TENURE

The SSR Chair of African Studies will be on a one-year full-time contractual appointment in the first instance, renewable up to three (3) years. The appointee may be eligible for re-appointment on the basis of performance, determined by Key Performance Indicators (KPIs), and assessed on six-monthly basis.

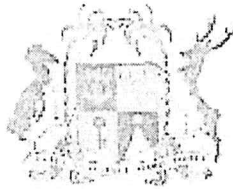

**Project Description**

The implementation of the Metro Express Project has given rise to opportunities for the redevelopment of a strategic area in the town centre into a modern urban terminal.

As a major transport interchange at this most strategic part of the town centre, the Quatre Bornes Urban Terminal is expected to be an iconic building, accommodating a mixed-use development. This project would contribute to the revitalization of the town centre, enhance the town centre image and identity by introducing high standards of building design and improvements to the public realm, facilities for pedestrians, cyclists and the disabled thus enabling a more efficient use of state lands, seamless public transport facilities and highway infrastructure.

The Government of the Republic of Mauritius wishes to induce active private sector participation and mobilise private investment in national infrastructure development projects with a view to modernising the economy and fuelling creation of employment, while promoting social integration in the mainstream economy.

In this connection and on behalf of the Government, the Ministry of Local Government and Disaster Risk Management is inviting proposals from promoters having the necessary experience, expertise and resources in the implementation

of the project to best represent the objectives and expectations of government regarding the redevelopment of the town centre of Quatre Bornes.
