



The Burundian Head of State joins the Islamic community of Burundi on the occasion of the celebration of Eid al-Adha



On Wednesday, May 23, 2026, the President of the Republic of Burundi, His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye, joined the Muslim community of Burundi in prayers marking the celebration of Eid al-Adha. The ceremonies, which were also attended by the Secretary General of the ruling CNDD-FDD party, took place on Independence Boulevard in the Mukaza district of the economic capital, Bujumbura, in an atmosphere imbued with faith, communion, and fraternity.

In his welcoming remarks, the Mufti of Burundi and Legal Representative of the Islamic Community of Burundi (COMIBU), Mr. Cheikh Salum Naya-

bagabo, warmly thanked the Burundian Head of State for agreeing to share the Eid al-Adha festivities with the Islamic community of Burundi. He took this opportunity to call upon Muslims to manage their harvests wisely, to continue development work, the cultivation of export crops, and to pay particular attention to children's education. He urged them to strengthen mutual support and to prepare calmly for the upcoming elections.

Africa Day 2026: Burundi reaffirms its commitment to a united, resilient, and prosperous Africa



Burundi celebrated Africa Day on 25 May 2026 in Bujumbura under the theme: "Ensuring sustainable access to water and safe sanitation systems to achieve the goals of Agenda 2063." Organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation in collaboration with the Group of African Ambassadors accredited to Burundi, the commemoration brought together the country's top authorities, the diplomatic corps, academics, representatives of civil society, and many young people. Presiding over the ceremonies at Intwari Stadium, the President of the Republic of Burundi and current Chairperson of the African Union, His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye, recalled that Africa Day is far more than a simple historical celebration. It symbolizes the continent's collective memory, the legacy of the struggles for African unity, and the ambition of a strong, prosperous Africa that is master of its own destiny. In his address, the Head of State called for a more united and solidarity-based Africa in the face of persistent challenges such as armed conflicts, terrorism, climate change, and humanitarian crises. He especially drew attention to the situation of children affected by these crises, stressing that educa-

tion must remain a priority, even in contexts of displacement and refuge. President Ndayishimiye also reaffirmed Burundi's commitment to promoting peace, regional integration, and sustainable development, while urging Africans to turn the ideals of pan-Africanism into concrete actions for the benefit of the people.

Addressing this year's theme dedicated to water and sanitation, he stressed that access to these essential services is a prerequisite for health, human dignity, and social stability. He also highlighted the importance of African culture and identity as drivers of unity and development, while calling on young people to become major actors in the continent's transformation through innovation, knowledge, and entrepreneurship. The celebration was also marked by exhibitions showcasing the products and expertise of African countries, as well as a roundtable discussion on the continent's major challenges.

Speaking as the first panelist, His Excellency Ambassador



Edouard Bizimana, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation, recalled that Africa is today celebrating 63 years of unity, integration, and cooperation. He noted that this commemoration takes

place in a particularly complex international context, marked by armed conflicts, terrorism, climate change, and epidemics challenges that disrupt production and supply chains and threaten the continent's development ambitions. The Minister emphasized the need for Africa to develop homegrown solutions in order to strengthen its economic independence and human development. According to him, the Agenda 2063 can only be achieved through visionary leadership, stronger cooperation among African states, and the mobilization of all the continent's vital forces.

The discussions focused on several strategic themes, notably diplomatic leadership, regional peace, African integration, and the transformation of education systems. Particular attention was paid to the role of youth, who are called upon to develop 21st-century skills, notably critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity, in order to contribute effectively to the continent's development. Through this celebration, Burundi reaffirmed its attachment to Pan-African ideals and its commitment to actively contributing to the achievement of Agenda 2063. **(MFARIDC)**

Adoption of the draft activity calendar for the period from May 25 to June 9, 2026



The elected representatives of the people met in plenary session on Tuesday, May 26, 2026, to review the draft schedule of activities for the ordinary parliamentary session of April 2026, covering the period from May 25 to June 9, 2026. According to the Speaker of the National Assembly, the Right Honorable Daniel Gélase Ndarirabe, Wednesday, May 27, 2026, was dedicated to the celebration of Eid al-Adha.

On Thursday, May 28, 2026, reports were presented on the visits conducted by the Honorable Members of Parliament to their respective constituencies during the parliamentary recess in March 2026.

On Tuesday, June 2, 2026, the Senate will analyze and adopt amendments to the bill concerning the missions, organization, and operation of the Court of Auditors, as well as the procedures for monitoring cases before said Court.

This session will also address the bill ratifying, by the Republic of Burundi, the agreement on the elimination of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income be-

tween the Government of the Republic of Burundi and the Government of the United Arab Emirates, and the



bill ratifying the agreement on the promotion and reciprocal protection of investments between the two countries.

On Friday, June 5, 2026, a plenary session will also be devoted to the analysis and adoption of Senate amendments to the draft budget settlement law and the budget report for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

The Standing Committee on Public Accounts, Finance, Economic Affairs, and Planning will also present its budget execution report for the first quarter of the 2025-2026 fiscal year, and oral questions with debate will be addressed to the Minister of Finance, Budget, and Digital Economy. Finally, Monday, June 8, 2026, will be dedicated to the celebration of National Patriotism Day. **(ABP)**

Meeting between the Burundian Minister of Foreign Affairs and the United Nations Special Representative to the African Union



On the sidelines of the 61st Ministerial Meeting of the United Nations Standing Advisory Committee on Security Questions in Central Africa (UNSAC), His Excellency Ambassador  douard Bizimana, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation, received in audience on Thursday, May 28, 2026, a delegation led by Mr. Onanga Anyanga, Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations to the African Union. This meeting was part of a courtesy visit.

The discussions between the two officials focused on topics of common interest, particularly those related to the ongoing work of UNOCA. Mr. Onanga Anyanga congratulated Minister Bizimana on Burundi's chairmanship of the African Union and commended the organization of the meeting of ministers from ECCAS member states' committee with UNOCA, a major and historic mechanism considered an essential instrument for strengthening peace and security in the region.

He emphasized that Burundi's simultaneous chairmanship of the AU and UNOCA illustrates a remarkable alignment of the country's commitments and investments. Expressing his gratitude, he highlighted the enlightened leadership of the Burundian President, His Excellency  variste Ndayishimiye, and assured him that the United Nations would support Burundi in implementing peace and security agreements, particularly within the framework of the Youth, Peace and Security Agenda. The Special Representative noted that Burundi is the only country up-to-date with its contributions to the mechanism, which demonstrates its constant commitment to the international community.



For his part, Minister Bizimana expressed Burundi's satisfaction with the support received from the United Nations in various sectors. He emphasized the need for partner-

ships whose activities have a concrete impact on the lives of the Burundian population.

Regarding the UNOCA mechanism, Ambassador Bizimana considered a six-month chairmanship too short to achieve the set objectives. He suggested that the relevant bodies meet to consider a more appropriate extension. It should be noted that Burundi will assume the chairmanship of the Standing

Committee of this mechanism on May 29, 2026, for the next six months.

In conclusion, the Minister reaffirmed Burundi's commitment to working closely with the United Nations across all its structures, thereby strengthening cooperation for the stability and prosperity of the African continent. **(MFARIDC)**

Meeting between the Minister of Foreign Affairs and private agencies recruiting migrant workers



On Thursday, May 28, 2026, in Bujumbura, His Excellency Ambassador Edouard Bizimana, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation, held an important meeting with representatives of private agencies recruiting Burundian workers abroad.

This meeting is part of a dynamic of consultation and dialogue aimed at strengthening the mechanisms for the supervision, training and protection of Burundian migrant workers.

The discussions covered several key points in particular: the challenges of pre-departure preparation; identifying the obstacles encountered by candidates before their departure, in order to ensure better preparation and successful integration in host countries; harmonization of good practices; establishing common standards in training and supervision to guarantee the quality and safety of migrant workers; promoting coordinated national approaches and aligning the actions of private agencies with the strategic orientations of the Government of Burundi for better-managed and beneficial migration to the

country.

The Consul General in Dubai shared enlightening testimonies about the realities experienced by Burundian workers abroad, highlighting the opportunities but also the challenges encountered.

Following the discussions, His Excellency Minister Bizimana offered a range of advice to the representatives present, emphasizing their noble duty to care for Burundian sons and daughters sent abroad, ensuring their dignity and safety. This meeting marks an important step in the Burundian government's commitment to strengthening migration governance and protecting its citizens abroad. It also illustrates the importance of partnerships between public institutions and private agencies in building a safer, more human, and more efficient migration system.

The meeting follows visits made by the ministry to certain recruitment agencies during which the ministry identified significant gaps.



During this meeting, in which the PAEJ participated, discussions focused on the PAEJ's expertise in youth financial empowerment and its capacity to train and support young people. In this context, collaboration

between the PAEJ and migrant worker recruitment agencies regarding candidate training was explored. (MFARIDC)

Burundi and UNESCO strengthen their cooperation



On the sidelines of the 61st ministerial meeting of the United Nations Standing Advisory Committee on Security Issues in Central Africa (UNSAC), the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation, Édouard Bizimana, received on Thursday, May 28, 2026 in Bujumbura a delegation led by Mputu Hilaire, UNESCO Regional Director for Central Africa, who came as part of a courtesy visit.

The discussions focused on strengthening the excel-

lent relations of friendship and cooperation that have long existed between Burundi and UNESCO. Mr. Hilaire welcomed this collaboration and expressed his desire to further consolidate it. Among the topics discussed were the monitoring and coordination of ongoing UNESCO projects in Burundi, as well as the progress of preparations for the Regional Peace and Security Forum scheduled for September 2026. According to Mr. Hilaire, Burundi's selection to host this forum was not accidental. The country hosts a UNESCO headquarters, currently holds the presidency of the African Union, and has played a major role in restoring peace and security in the region, particularly in eastern DRC.

Minister Bizimana expressed his satisfaction with the quality of relations with UNESCO, noting that reports on Burundi from Paris are very positive. He reiterated the importance of UNESCO's work in key sectors such as education, youth, culture, and the arts. The Minister also mentioned Burundi's desire to see certain natural and tourist sites registered as cultural heritage sites, notably the Rusizi Park and the Kibira Park.

Regarding ongoing projects and the regional forum, Édouard Bizimana assured that bilateral exchanges would continue. He reaffirmed Burundi's commitment to working closely with UNESCO to strengthen cooperation and promote peace and security in the region. (MFARIDC)

From May 25 to 29, 2026, Bujumbura will host the 61st Meeting of the United Nations Permanent Advisory Committee on Security Issues in Central Africa (UNSAC), under the theme: "Strengthening regional mechanisms for the prevention, mediation and peaceful settlement of conflicts for lasting peace and resilient development in Central Africa". Activities began with the work of the UNOCA focal points. On May 26, 2026, the experts officially began their work, which will continue for three days, in preparation for the 61st ministerial meeting scheduled for May 29, 2026.

In his welcoming remarks, Mr. Sophonie Nitunga, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration, and Development Cooperation, warmly welcomed the representatives of the eleven (11) member states of the Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS). He expressed his gratitude to the participants for their presence and their unwavering commitment

to peace, stability, and security in the sub-region. He wished them fruitful discussions, emphasizing that the conclusions of their work would serve as the basis for the discussions at the ministerial meeting on



Friday, May 29, 2026.

Mr. Sophonie Nitunga also indicated that this session of experts constitutes a fundamental step in the process of reflection and formulation of the guidelines that will direct the work of the decision-making bodies. According to him, the analyses, expertise, and in-depth knowledge of the realities on the ground possessed by the experts represent an essential contribution to the quality of the conclusions that will be submitted to higher levels.

Following the opening ceremony, the proceedings began with the presentation of the outgoing bureau's report, followed by the election of the new bureau. As a result of this election, the Republic of Burundi was elected Chair of the Committee, while Gabon was elected First Vice-Chair and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) Second Vice-Chair. **(MFARIDC)**

61st UNISAC meeting: Experts from ECCAS member states united in a symbolic tree-planting activity



As part of the 61st meeting of the United Nations Standing Advisory Committee on Security Questions in Central Africa, held in Bujumbura from May 25 to 29, 2026, the experts' work was marked on May 28, 2026, by a field trip punctuated by a symbolic tree-planting activity on Kibogoye-Muremera Hill, located in the Bugarama area, Muramvya commune, Gitega province. These trees were planted by delegates from the member countries of the ECCAS (Economic Community of Central African States). In his welcoming remarks, the Governor of Gitega Province, Mr. Liboire Bigirimana, indicated that the presence of the delegations at this tree-planting activity constitutes a strong sign of their common commitment to peace, security, solidarity and regional cooperation. He empha-

sized that this symbolic presence demonstrates that the ties uniting the nations of the sub-region transcend geographical borders, deeply rooted in the values of fraternity, peaceful coexistence, and a shared destiny. He also specified that this tree planting holds particular importance for environmental protection in facing climate change.

The Assistant to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and Development Cooperation, Mr. Adolphe Bukuru, indicated that this tree-planting activity embodies the theme of the 61st UNISAC Ministerial Meeting, namely: "Strengthening regional mechanisms for conflict prevention, mediation and peaceful resolution for sustainable peace and resilient development in Central Africa" He stated that this initiative reflects the shared conviction that peace, security and environmental protection are closely linked.

Mr. Adolphe Bukuru also recalled that Burundi remains committed to regional efforts aimed at promoting lasting peace through dialogue, mediation and cooperation between the states of Central Africa.

According to him, the planted tree represents much more than a simple environmental gesture. It symbolizes the collective commitment of member states to peace, regional solidarity, conflict prevention, and build-

UNSAC: Burundi elected to the presidency of the organization and reaffirms its commitment to peace and security in Central Africa



The work of the 61st Meeting of the United Nations Standing Advisory Committee on Security Questions in Central Africa (UNSAC) concluded on May 29, 2026 in Bujumbura with a ministerial meeting marked by important decisions aimed at strengthening peace, security and regional cooperation.

In his welcoming remarks, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration, and Development Cooperation, His Excellency Ambassador Édouard Bizimana, emphasized that this 61st meeting was taking place within a regional and international context characterized by profound changes and complex, interconnected security challenges whose repercussions extend beyond national borders. He indicated that these challenges are now compounded by new factors of instability such as climate change, socio-economic pressures, and recurring humanitarian crises.

In light of this situation, he reiterated that no single state can provide lasting solutions to the challenges facing the region. He reaffirmed Burundi's commitment to the ideals of peace, peaceful coexistence, and regional cooperation, while also reiterating its willingness to continue collaborating with other member states to promote stability and sustainable development in Central Africa.

Following the opening remarks, participants listened to the presentation of the outgoing Bureau's report before

proceeding to the election of the new UNSAC Bureau. At the conclusion of the vote, Burundi was elected President of the organization, Gabon First Vice-President, the Democratic Republic of Congo Second Vice-President, while the Republic of Congo will assume the Secretariat.

During the handover ceremony, His Excellency Ambassador Édouard BIZIMANA thanked the member states for the trust placed in Burundi and assured that his country would spare no effort to responsibly assume the missions entrusted to it.

The activities of this ministerial meeting then continued with the review and adoption of the report of the 61st UNSAC meeting before the continuation of the work behind closed doors.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the ministers adopted a declaration on the prevention of internal displacement and the protection of displaced persons in Central Africa. In this document, they reaffirmed their commitment to the relevant instruments of the United Nations, the African Union, the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (ICGLR) and the Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS) relating to the prevention of internal displacement, the protection and assistance of internally displaced persons, and the promotion of sustainable solutions.

The participants also adopted the Bujumbura Declaration on strengthening regional mechanisms for conflict prevention, mediation, and peaceful resolution for sustainable peace and resilient development in Central Africa. Through this declaration, they reaffirmed their commitment to promoting a culture of peace, dialogue, tolerance, cooperation, and the peaceful settlement of disputes, in accordance with the principles of the Charter of the United Nations.

In his closing remarks, His Excellency Ambassador Édouard Bizimana expressed his sincere gratitude to the participants for their commitment and the high quality of the discussions that characterized the proceedings. He empha-

sized that the discussions demonstrated once again that the challenges facing Central Africa require collective, coordinated, and united responses. He also reaffirmed the Burundian government's conviction that only a concerted approach will lead to lasting solutions to the region's shared challenges.

In a press briefing held at the end of the meeting, the Minister described the 61st UNSAC Ministerial Meeting as particularly fruitful. He indicated that several

challenges affecting the region were examined and that Member States committed to working together to find lasting solutions.

Speaking about Burundi's role as Chair of the African Union, he stressed that the country is relentlessly pursuing its efforts to combat terrorism and promote dialogue as the preferred means of preventing and peacefully resolving conflicts. **(MFARIDC)**

Towards an inclusive and consensual electoral process

As part of preparations for the upcoming peaceful presidential elections, the Governor of Butanyerera Province, Mr. Victor Segasago, accompanied by the Vice-President of the Independent National Electoral Commission (CENI), Mrs. Victoire Nahimana, held a meeting on Monday, May 25, 2026, in the provincial capital, for the leaders of the various political parties registered

in the province, representatives of civil society organizations, religious leaders, and communal administrators.

This meeting also aimed at implementing the recommendations from the meeting of May 15, 2026, chaired by the Head of State and bringing together all stakeholders in the electoral process. A total of forty-two (42) recommendations were formulated. Among these was

a measure to strengthen trust among stakeholders by integrating representatives of political parties, religious denominations, and civil society organizations into the



Independent Provincial Electoral Commissions (CEPI), the Independent Communal Electoral Commissions (CECI), and polling stations, in accordance with Articles 38 and 40 of Law No. 1/12 of June 5, 2024, concerning the Electoral Code of Burundi.

According to the agreed provisions, the Independent Provincial Electoral Commission (CEPI) of Butanyera will be composed of 10 members, three (3) of whom will be elected at this meeting, while the remaining seven (7) will be appointed by the CENI (Independent National Electoral Commission). The three (3) selected members are: Mr. Placide Migambi, of Hutu ethnicity, representing religious denominations; Mrs. Marvella

Nkurunziza, of Tutsi ethnicity, nominated by civil society organizations; and Mr. Célestin Minani, of Hutu ethnicity, nominated by political parties.

Participants at this meeting recommended continued dialogue among political actors in the province before and after the elections. They emphasized the need for political parties to work together, promote a shared vision, uphold



the law, and prioritize the province's development. Governor Segasago expressed his satisfaction with the consensus reached in appointing the members of the Independent National Electoral Commission (CEPI). He urged these political and social actors to maintain this spirit to ensure peaceful elections. **(ABP)**

Media Awards 2026: Eleven journalists, including six women, received awards



Continuing the activities marking the celebration of International Press Freedom Day, the National Communication Council (CNC) in collaboration with the Press House and the Association of Women Journalists (AFJO), proceeded, on the evening of Tuesday, May 26, 2026, to the awarding of prizes to the winners of three competitions organized as part of the 2026 Media Prize edition. Eleven (11) journalists, including six women and five men, were awarded prizes.

Three competitions were held under three different themes. The competition organized by the National Communication Council awarded prizes to the best journalistic productions under the theme: "Media and Public Health for an Emerging Burundi by 2040 and a Developed Burundi by 2060" The competition, organized by the Press House, focused on the theme: "Inclusive Governance and Climate Resilience for Lasting Peace in Burundi." The Gender and Media Prize, organized by the Association of Women Journalists, was themed "Women's Action in Promoting and Defending Justice and the Rights of Women and Girls" Prizes ranged from one million to two million Burundian francs (BIF) and included laptops valued at BIF 5 million each.

According to Mrs. Espérance Ndayizeye, President of the National Communication Council, the annual media awards have become a cherished tradition, reflecting a shared commitment to promoting media professionalism and encouraging journalists to diversify their areas of ex-

pertise for the benefit of information consumers. Mrs. Mireille Kanyange, Representative of the Press House, stated that a well-informed journalist remains essential in defending justice, fundamental freedoms, and media credibility. She called on media professionals to be guardians of truth and transparency. Mrs. Kanyange also noted that the date of the 2027 International Press Freedom Day will coincide with the presidential elections in Burundi. Therefore, she urged journalists to exercise wisdom, responsibility, and impartiality so that every piece of information they disseminate contributes to preserving

peace, trust, and national unity. "It is through this unity, solidarity, and professionalism that Burundi continues to promote a responsible press and build a future of lasting peace," he stated. As for the President of the Association of Women Journalists, Mrs. Francine Ndi-hokubwayo, she called on media leaders to continue providing spaces that foster equal opportunities, promote women journalists, and produce inclusive content. She affirmed that, despite the progress observed, women remain underrepresented in media content, often portrayed as experts, decision-makers, or sources of information. (Le Renouveau)
